Prayer after Communion: Having received this pledge of eternal redemption we pray Almighty God that as the feast day of our salvation draws ever nearer, so we may press forward all the more eagerly to the worthy celebration of the mystery of Your Son’s Nativity, Who lives and reigns forever and ever.....



MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

We light the fourth candle of our Advent wreaths this weekend, symbolizing the fourth millennium of recorded history before the Birth of Christ, our God entering history. That beautiful word

“Incarnation,” is used in the Opening Prayer of today, an oration which will sound familiar to us from the recitation of the Rosary, highlighting Mary’s essential role in this turning point of human history. Throughout Advent we have noted the progress of her pregnancy, as she through faith becomes Mother of our Savior and Mother of the Church. Her example has been for us an inspiration, as we have examined our lives for evidence that the Birth of her Son has truly made a difference in our lives.

The Season of Advent ends and the Season of Christmas begins with the Mass of the Vigil. This second season of our Year of Worship, will be highlighted by four more solemn days, stretching from the evening of 24 December through the evening of 7 January. As the four weeks of Advent represented four millennia before the Birth of Jesus, we can consider these two weeks as representative of the two millennia since His Birth. The mysteries to be highlighted include: The Nativity (25 December); the fact that He was born into a family (31 December); the wondrous role played out by His mother (1 January); and, the truth that His message is meant for all cultures (7 January). We will celebrate these solemnities as we have the weeks of Advent, with the candles on our wreaths. Here is the schedule of Masses:
