MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

On our calendar of worship, we moved quite quickly from the infancy narratives about Jesus, to the beginnings of His ministry in adulthood. Other than two episodes, the flight to Egypt while still an infant and the Temple conversation with scholars at age twelve, there is little-to-no coverage in the Gospels of Jesus' years between infancy and adulthood. There are interesting theories about where Jesus was and about what He was doing between ages twelve and thirty; and, much has been written about these so-called "hidden years." One idea that I have studied has to do with travel to western England, and another speculates that He spent some years in a Buddhist monastery in the Himalayas. The speculation is interesting, but is still speculation.

Of far greater importance is what we do have in our Gospel selections. Today, having received His own call in Baptism, Jesus begins to call His Apostles; He selects the biological brothers Simon (Peter) and Andrew. Next week, He will confirm the trio who will be with Him in some of His most memorable moments: Peter, James, and John. With Andrew (who is mentioned again next week) and eight others, they will be the original Twelve who move from the position of disciple/follower, to the position of Apostle or Church Planter. Some of the most recent teaching about these original Twelve can be found in the writings of the late Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. These twelve and other followers of Jesus will watch with us as over the next three weeks, we see Jesus exercise His ministry of compassionate healing of unclean spirits (Fourth Sunday), Peter's mother-in-law (Fifth Sunday), and the dreaded leprosy (Sixth Sunday).

The ministry of Jesus continues for us in the Roman Catholic Tradition in what we call our System of Seven Sacraments. One sacrament to which we are paying close attention locally this week-end is Matrimony. It was at a wedding celebration in the village of Cana that Jesus began His public ministry. We are celebrating a marriage which took place at the Main Post Chapel of Fort Knox on 11 January of 1964. The bride and groom were Byrle Davidson and Walker Thomas. We are joining Mr. & Mrs. Thomas and their family at Saint Ambrose on Saturday evening, as they pray in thanksgiving for the blessings of the years; and we thank them for the beautiful example of the joy of Christ-like living which they provide for us.

The first week-end of the new year saw the official launch of the Capital Campaign at Saint Ambrose. This is an effort to procure donations towards a goal of \$175,000.00 to cover the cost of the inspirational elements of our current renovation project: steeple & cross; sanctuary furnishings, and stained-glass windows. 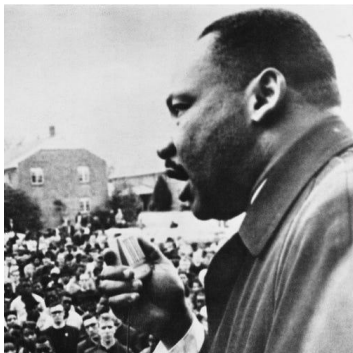
