MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Thursday of this week is the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, the most prolific writer in the Christian Scriptures (13 of 27 titles), and arguably the greatest academic teacher about faith in Christ whom the world has ever known. Last Thursday (18 January) we celebrated the Feast of Saint Peter at Antioch, the first pope and "running mate" to Saint Paul in the apostolic leadership of the early decades of the church. These two dates (18 and 25 January) are the "book-ends" of what for over a half century has been known as "The Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity; these days, we more commonly call it a Week of Prayer. Pope Francis will be joined by the leadership of other communities in faith in a service of prayer and renewed commitment toward the fulfillment of the prayer of Jesus at the Last Supper, "that they may all be one," (John 17:21).

This ecumenical experience of religious belief and worship was more the exception than the norm in our world, nation, and local community, prior to the Papacy of Saint John XXIIIrd (1958-1963). The Second Vatican Council which he convened in Rome, involved the representatives of non-Catholic communities and traditions from all over the world. As a "baby boomer," who has clear memories of the segregation among religious denominations, I still read that last sentence with a great deal of wonder. And while we have a very fine history of shared prayer with the protestant congregations of Colesburg and White Mills, it continues to be a disappointment that pastors in Cecilia have not been more responsive to my invitations. Thus, "the Week of Prayer" or "Prayer of the Weak," continues.

I would be remiss if I failed to mention the observance last Monday of the annual national holiday in honor of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., whose work was carried on and surely strengthened by a pronounced spirit of ecumenism. Our Archbishop Shelton Fabre, a national leader in today's civil rights movement, presided at an ecumenical service of remembrance at the Cathedral of the Assumption on 15 January.
