MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

The caption which follows the list of Scripture passages for the Liturgy of the Word today, is a bit unusual; it warrants some explanation. Michael McGivney is an American priest who only three years ago, was beautified, the second of three steps in the official process of canonization, becoming a Saint of the Catholic Church. With the title of Blessed, the Church indicates that this is someone whose holiness of life here on earth suggests that he has a place in heaven, and deserves mention in our prayers. The Latin phrase means "Jesus lives" and is a form of greeting among the membership of the world-wide organization which was founded in 1882 at New Haven in Connecticut by Blessed McGivney, the Knights of Columbus.

With vibrant K of C Councils in Vine Grove and Elizabethtown (and many others throughout all the Dioceses of the Commonwealth), we have many Knights among the membership of our two parishes. You are very keenly aware of the charitable causes which the organization continues to support in the well-over one hundred years of its service in our area. In recent weeks you have heard me speak of the generous support from two of the groups in our county, and I fully expect to hear from others in the near future. Later this month, the 59th Annual Brotherhood Banquet hosted by Council 1455 will again raise a large sum of money in support of Kosair Children's Charities. Raffle tickets for a freezer full of beef will be available here at the parish for ten dollars. You may, however, be a bit less familiar with the life of Blessed McGivney as well as the circumstances and motivations which caused him to establish this Fraternal Order.

As we are instructed in the Gospel selections of the weeks leading up to Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent, we find that Jesus in responding to the call of His Father, is compassionately touching the lives of people in very personal ways. This is what Blessed McGivney, in his relatively brief (13 years) career as a priest pursued, and what he organized the Knights to carry on after him. Ordained in 1877, Father McGivney served a working-class population, many of whom labored in the high-risk forces of First Responders (Fire Fighting and Law Enforcement). All too often then, as now, people in those jobs, typically the primary "bread winner" of a family, made the ultimate sacrifice. Unlike now, the people of the 19th century had no pensions, insurance plans, and other means of support. Father McGivney's "Knights" created a self-insurance" program, so that the parishes could provide support. Today that mission continues on the international level as a corporate entity, and as a local expression of the love of Christ, living in the world today.
