MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Very often today, in our effort to be genteel and sensitive to people who are facing harsh reality and its pain, we speak of human death in softer terms. We will speak of the inevitable experience with phrases like, "If something should happen to me...." or "when my time comes." When someone dies, we speak of them as "passing" or "going home." In the viewing parlor of funeral homes and mortuaries, in the midst of a profusion of flowers, ferns, and other symbols of life, one often hears phrases like, "She looks so natural...." "he seems to be asleep." We want to avoid the "D" word.

In today's gospel, however, Jesus is quite direct. When the disciples miss His understanding, He hits the nail on the head by saying "Lazarus has died!" His dear friend Mary of Bethany, Lazarus' sister, with a nuance of exasperation with Jesus, says, "Lord, if You had been here my brother would not have died!" She's rather direct too. This most universal of human experiences is precisely what is going to happen to our Lord Himself. And, His bringing Lazarus back to life is what He uses to broaden His following as He moves closer to the end of His earthly ministry. In fact it gets Him a bit of unwelcome attention, as the Jewish leaders plot to get Jesus and Lazarus too!

And while they might have held Lazarus and Jesus in the same regard, we as modern believers see a major difference. The experience of Lazarus is a **resuscitation**; that of Jesus is **resurrection**. Lazarus came forth from the grave, but eventually went back to it. Jesus left the tomb, to live forever. We continue to reflect on how this happens and what it means for us on Easter and beyond.

Another way in which we proclaim our redemption in Christ, is by steeping our churches with bell towers and crosses. The refurbishment of these items for Saint Ambrose is now complete, and will be mechanically put in place at 8:00 am., on Tuesday 19 March, weather permitting. The fabricating firm (Campbellsville Industries) welcomes us to come and be a part of this historic moment. We are encouraged to bring "Sharpie" style indelible markers, with which to inscribe our names, a prayer, a favorite verse from Scripture, etc., to be enshrined for future generations.
