Prayer Over the Offerings: Accept we ask O Lord, the prayers of Your people with the sacrificial offerings, that what has begun in the paschal mysteries may by the working of Your power, bring us to the healing of eternity, through Christ our Lord.....

Prayer after Communion: Pour out on us O Lord the Spirit of Your love and in Your kindness, make those You have nourished by this Paschal Sacrament one in mind and heart, through Christ our Lord.....

Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection, Year B; 31 March, 2024

Collect or Opening Prayer: O God Who on this day through Your only begotten Son have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's resurrection, may through the renewal brought by Your Spirit, rise up in the light of life, through Christ our Lord.

Prayer Over the Offerings: Exultant with paschal gladness, O Lord. we offer the sacrifice by which Your Church is wondrously reborn and nourished, through Christ our Lord.....

Prayer after Communion: Look upon Your Church, O God, with unfailing love and favor so that renewed by the paschal mysteries, she may come to the glory of the Resurrection, through Christ our Lord.....



MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

As is our custom, we are printing the assigned readings and prayers in the parish bulletin. Our purpose is so that we can literally "take something home with us," and perhaps review them in private prayer. It should be no surprise that, as last weekend and this weekend form the center-piece of our year, there is a proliferation of these passages. Note especially that there are seven (not counting three more at Mass) on the Vigil of Easter. We proclaim those in concentrated form at Church, but encourage the full form at home.

Another item which is very rich in meaning and beauty but can easily be overlooked because it is solely at the Vigil Service is the Easter Proclamation, better known as the Exsultet. It is sung, not usually recited, by deacon, priest, or bishop; we presented the words for reflection last week. The text is different from that found in the Missalette (Saints Clare and Ignatius, pp. 146-149, Saint Ambrose, pp. 40-43). This one is from the Missal of Pope Paul VI which I learned for ordination; the Missalette has text from the Missal of Pope John Paul II, issued in more recent years. May all among us know the grace and Joy of the Risen Jesus.
