### MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

With the beginning of November, the final month of our Liturgical Year, we have passed the autumn triduum of Halloween, All Saints Day, and All Souls Day. This is a time of reflection on how we spend this life in preparation for eternal life. We are also considering the lives of loved ones and others we have admired, toward discovering those ways in which we can keep their good qualities, their virtues, alive in our lives. This is what it means to remember.....to take something from the past and activate it in the now. November is a special month for remembering.

Of course, the One Who teaches us about remembering is the greatest of teachers, our very Savior Jesus Christ. During the Last Supper just about eighteen hours before He died on the Cross, He spoke of His role as Teacher and instructed us with the words, “Remember me.” We repeat and renew that moment in every Mass. We remember Jesus, and we remember loved ones, usually by name. Having known and lived with them, it is natural and easy to remember them. It can be equally easy to remember Jesus, if we make the effort to learn about Him and His life. Of many sources for learning about Christ, the Gospels According to Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John are most fundamental. However, the New Testament essay, Letter to the Hebrews is another wonderful source of instruction about the role of Jesus. The selection which we hear in today’s Mass is the sixth of seven consecutive weeks. This book highlights the role of the Temple priest as the one who offers sacrifice. The lesson it teaches is that Jesus is the perfect priest, because He offers Himself, the perfect sacrifice.

As most of you know, I “wear the hat” of a retired military chaplain as well as that of a civilian priest/administrator in pastoral ministry. This is the time of the year when the two seem to be almost equally prominent. I will be called upon to participate in patriotic gatherings and memorial services around the observance of Veterans/Armistice Day. The actual day of course is tomorrow, 11 November. However, there will be various ceremonies throughout the week and month which will find me in uniform serving at various venues around the Commonwealth. Best wishes to all veterans, and to those who appreciate them.

I am absolutely convinced that I am spiritually and emotionally more successful at coping with the loss of loved ones in their deaths, and in preparing for my own, by the annual observance, prayerfully of these three days, by finding and keeping Jesus as the focus and source of meaning for this time of the year.

## FAMILY-CENTERED FAITH FORMATION FOR CHILDREN
