

MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Does it seem like the holidays were over quickly? Does it seem like they are still lingering? I suppose each of us has her/his own experience of the passing of time. Maybe the holidays were over for you with the first day back to work after Christmas? Maybe your decorations are still up and giving you enjoyment; maybe you are still reading over the Christmas cards once more before tossing them out or putting them in storage? However quickly or slowly you have experienced the Christmas/New Year holidays, we have turned those pages on the calendar, and the year is moving on.

Before we leave the holidays completely though, I want to express thanks for all those who helped with cleaning and decorating in all three churches: Saint Ambrose, Saint Clare, and Saint Ignatius. You did a beautiful job. Saint Ignatius had (to my knowledge) its first ever live animal Nativity scene. Up until the week-end of Epiphany (4-5 January) we had mild weather and that made for generally good attendance. I am re-printing the schedule with the attendance numbers, for two reasons: so that we have data for planning purposes next year, and to remind ourselves of the strength we obtain from knowing that we express our faith, not in isolation, but with the support of our fellow believers.

I feel that support personally. As I often say: As a priest, I can celebrate Mass alone, but it is much more fun when you're here. And once again, I want to express my gratitude for your many and generous gifts, beautiful cards, and sweet sentiments.

And now, we experience a fairly sudden shift, from Gospel stories of the Infancy of Our Lord, to the beginning of the final three years of His life and ministry on earth. Today's passage from the account of Saint Luke describes that moment when Jesus as an adult, accepts baptism from His cousin John. We celebrate that moment and hear the Father's voice affirming Jesus as the One for us to follow.
