## Third Sunday of Advent, Year C; 15 December, 2024

Zephaniah 3:14-18; Isaiah 12:2-6; Philippians 4:4-7; Isaiah 61; Luke 3:10-18

*"Rejoice in the Lord always; I say it again, Rejoice!"*

**Collect or Opening Prayer:** O God Who see how Your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing, through Christ our Lord .....

**Prayer Over the Offerings:** May the sacrifice of our worship Lord, be offered to You unceasingly, to complete what was begun in sacred mystery and powerfully accomplish for us Your saving work, through Christ our Lord.....

**Prayer after Communion:** We implore Your mercy Lord, that this divine sustenance may cleanse us of our faults and prepare us for the coming feasts, through Christ our Lord.....



### MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Again this week our Scriptural lessons highlight the mission of the prophets who proclaim to the world that the Birth of the Savior is near. Zephaniah, like Baruch from whom we heard last week, is listed as a "minor" prophet; still his theme of joy is especially appropriate. We also hear again from the Prophet whom Jesus called "the Greatest," John the Baptist, actually a cousin to the Lord on His mother's side. And even though his message is inserted in the line-up of readings in the place where we usually read the Psalm, we have today some lines from Isaiah, the most prolific writer of the Hebrew Scriptures. This is the one who eight hundred years prior to Jesus' Birth, gives details of what is to come; he also writes movingly of Jesus' suffering and death.

This Third of the four Sundays of Advent is called "Gaudete" Sunday, the Sunday (Week) of Joy. The first word of the first prayer in this week-end's Mass is "Rejoice," (cf., Entrance Antiphon, from Philippians 4:4-5). It is repeated as the Second Reading of the Mass. As kids, we were taught to be happy because we are half-way through Advent! On this year's calendar we are just over half-way; there have been fifteen days so far, and there are ten to go. Surely the commercial world is aware as it proclaims, "Ten more shopping days till Christmas!" And in church, we light the third candle, the pink one; in some places the option of pink vestments is exercised.

There truly is cause for rejoicing.....whether for those contemporaries of Zephaniah, Isaiah, and John, who awaited the Messiah over those four thousand years of recorded history, or for us who light the candles. The Savior comes to the world as a person like ourselves, and His coming makes an incalculable difference. In Matthew's account of the Gospel, there is a very remarkable conversation between the adult Jesus, newly arrived on the preaching circuit, and some followers of John the Baptist. John in prison has heard about the new preacher and wants to know if He is the One for Whom everybody has been looking? Jesus does not give them a straight answer. Rather He says, "Tell John what you have seen, the blind, the deaf, the lame, the lepers are being healed, and the poor have the good news preached to them," (Matthew 11:2-6). We can add.....'We now have a God Who loves us in spite of our weak and sinful condition.' We celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing at all the Masses this week-end.
