MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

In these waning days of Summer, as we anticipate our entry into Autumn and Winter, I find it rather natural to focus my reflection on renewal. That dynamic is very much evident in all three of our communities: the parishes of Saint Ambrose and Saint Ignatius, and the Oratory of Saint Clare. Let's take a brief look in reverse order. At Saint Clare in Colesburg, the asphalt around the church building was re-sealed and re-striped back in the Spring. The lane through the cemetery was re-rocked at that time and is scheduled to receive asphalt and sealing this month. At Saint Ignatius in White Mills, bids are being reviewed for the restoration of the church windows and the renewal of the stained glass from the abstract geometric pattern to inspirational imaging on biblical and religious themes.

At Saint Ambrose in Cecilia, the historic renovation has been under way since the beginning of the calendar year. On Ash Wednesday (14 February) Mass was celebrated in the parish hall for the first time, a practice which will continue until such time as we can resume our celebrations in church. Each week we see ourselves moving closer to that happy moment. Specifically, we can note the following steps (and this is not a complete list): doors, steps, and walkways; asbestos abatement; plumbing and electricity; dry-wall and insulation; arching beams and trim work inside; painting of chimney, gutters, and downspouts outside; sowing and cultivating of grass; pews, cabinets, sanctuary furniture which are being built at off-site locations. Naturally, it seems like this work is taking a long time; it is. However, patience is the key to doing any job thoroughly.

I also want to point out the spiritual dimension of all this renewal. For nearly ten years now, our Holy Father Pope Francis I has promoted the “World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation” on 1 September, which begins “the Season of Creation,” which concludes on 4 October, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. The Pope encourages us to *“reaffirm our personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which He has entrusted to our care, and to implore His help for the protection of creation as well as His pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live.”*

Toward that end, we will have our quarterly celebration of the Sacraments of Weakness as follows:

Anointing	22-23 September	St. Ambrose & St. Ignatius
Reconciliation	29-30 September	St. Ambrose & St. Ignatius
Both	6 October	St. Clare Oratory

FAMILY-CENTERED FAITH FORMATION FOR CHILDREN

St. Ambrose faith formation is a family-centered program that provides families with age-appropriate materials for your children to learn about their faith at home on your own schedule. There are no class times (with the exception of Confirmation) and families can choose to participate in service activities that are offered through the parish twice a month if they choose. If your child is in need of a Sacrament, Father Ben will work one-on-one with your family (except Confirmation - see details below) in addition to the materials you work on at home.
