MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Well, after sixteen consecutive "named" Sundays, through Lent, Easter, Ascension, and The Post-Easter Solemnities, we return to the Season of Ordinary Time. These are the thirty-three Sundays which do not have a special name, which includes several between Christmas and Lent, and now twenty-two more before the Solemnity of Christ the King in the Fall of the year. I always like to ask: "What's so ordinary about Ordinary Time?" This question always leads me to reflect on how our faith in Christ can prompt us to discern His Presence, His "extraordinary" Presence in the ordinary experiences of life.

In two of our three major readings from Sacred Scripture today, we learn of one of the most beautiful and helpful images used in the teaching/learning our faith. It is the tree, which Ezekiel uses as a metaphor and Jesus uses in the form of one of His best-loved parables, "the mustard seed." The tree is seen as providing refreshing shade and a home for birds, as well as a pure source of majestic beauty. I find it also a wonderful image for the church especially with its sacramental system, which in a beautiful way, provides us with refreshment, renewal, and comfort. Among our **Growing In Faith Together** lessons, three are about Sacraments. The first provides an overall introduction to the sacramental system presenting the many symbols which are used. That lesson is called Sacraments of Belonging, and teaches about Baptism, Confirmation, and Communion. We pair the Sacraments of Matrimony and Holy Orders as the Sacraments of Promise. Similarly we pair the Sacraments of Anointing and Reconciliation as the Sacraments of Weakness.

As is our quarterly custom, we are taking two consecutive Sundays at this time of seasonal change, to focus on this pair of sacraments. They help us to embrace an understanding of ourselves as a people with physical and emotional limitations, as well as behavioral and character flaws. That understanding, with the Grace of Christ is celebrated, indeed His very Presence is realized in the Sacraments of Anointing and Reconciliation. This deepens our belief that in Jesus, the 'trunk of our spiritual tree,' we have a God Who doesn't say 'I love you if you are perfect,' but Who rather says, "I love you even if you are imperfect."
