MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

The longest season of our Liturgical Year, the Season of Ordinary Time, is rapidly winding down; less than two weeks remain. On 30 November, Advent begins and we start not only a new Season but a brand-new Year of Worship. But lest we get ahead of ourselves, the Church offers us a great moment of climax, the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. This annual transition, bringing one year to a close and opening another, is a time of special prayer and reflection. We consider carefully and prayerfully the ways in which Jesus our Lord and King touches and enriches our lives.

For over twenty years now three churches in southern Hardin County have joined together for ecumenical prayer on the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day. Next Sunday 24 November, Saint Ignatius will host White Mills Baptist and White Mills Christian Churches at 6:00 p.m., for a Service to include Scripture Reading, Special Music, Reflection and Prayer. Whenever we worship ecumenically, that is, joining different denominations together, we are responding positively to the prayer of Jesus Himself, “that they may all be one, Father, as You and I are One,” (John 17:21).

As this bulletin goes to press, the Federal and State Election of 5 November, 2024 goes into the nation’s history, with a clear majority of the votes being cast for Donald J. Trump. He will take the oath of office on 20 January of 2025, becoming only the second President to serve two terms not in succession. President Grover Cleveland served as the 22nd President (1885 – 1889) and as the 24th President (1893 – 1897). President-Elect Trump served as the 45th President (2017 – 2021) and now prepares to serve as the 47th President (2025 – 2029). May Almighty God guide him and the Nation in the preservation of liberty and justice for all.

As this bulletin is going to press, we are preparing to accept a bid for the installation of a much-needed roof on the community hall at Saint Clare Oratory in Colesburg. We had some local bids, but this one, obtained for us by the Archdiocesan Director of Facilities Management, saves a substantial amount and needs no further approval. Details will be in the next Parish Council Meeting Minutes.

FAMILY-CENTERED FAITH FORMATION FOR CHILDREN

St. Ambrose faith formation is a family-centered program that provides families with age-appropriate materials for your children to learn about their faith at home on your own schedule. There are no class times (with the exception of Confirmation) and families can choose to participate in service activities that are offered through the parish twice a month if they choose. If your child is in need of a Sacrament, Father Ben will work one-on-one with your family (except Confirmation - see details below) in addition to the materials you work on at home.
