**MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN**

One element of our Catholic teaching and practice which is universal, but at the same time specific to particular nations and cultures, is the observance of Holy Days of Obligation. So, the list of six which we have kept in the United States, for example, may differ from those observed in Mexico or Poland or Great Britain. The Feast of the Assumption of Mary Into Heaven was observed on Thursday of this past week. When Pope Pius XII established this day to honor Mary, it was with great ceremony and festivity in Rome on 15 August of 1950; and it was greeted with joy all over the world, but particularly in the United States. As Americans, we like to have popular input into our governance; we call it the democratic (notice the lower-case d) process. And that was used in this case. Study groups and discussions were held in parishes, schools, seminaries, convents, etc., and from that ground-swell was expressed our assumption that Mary, who like Our Lord experienced human death, but who went immediately to Heaven where she reigns as Queen of all the Saints. One week from today, we observe her Coronation, not as a Holy Day in the same sense, but as the Fifth Glorious Mystery of the Rosary.

In recent days, multiple members of our parishes have made fervent prayers that Our Blessed Mother would welcome our loved ones to Heaven. Debbie Cripps, mother of Megan O'Daniel of Saint Ambrose was buried on 9 August; Judy Pittman Nall, mother of Jason Nall of Saint Ignatius, was buried on 12 August; Larry Dupont, brother of Gail Dupont Hunt of Saint Ignatius was buried on 13 August; Edith Brown Finch, sister of Father Ben Brown, was buried on 17 August; and Geneva Skees Hatfield, sister of Calvin Skees of Saint Ambrose and of Violet Skees Stith of Saint Ignatius will be buried on Monday of this week. May they rest in peace.

Another who will welcome us and our loved ones into heaven is Saint Clare of Assisi, who has been in heaven for well-over 900 years. Last Sunday, we celebrated the 150th anniversary of the Oratory Church named in her honor, with a Mass presided over by Archbishop Shelton Fabre and attended by a congregation in excess of 250 people. Many, especially those who do not attend monthly Masses at Saint Clare, remarked at the beauty of the church and the grounds, as well as the wonderful hospitality and reception provided by the many volunteers. We are grateful too, for Don Waters' research and presentation on the history of faith in Colesburg. I was personally very proud of all that was accomplished on this historic day.
