MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

Where is the missing Sunday? On our secular calendar, today is the third Sunday of the new year, 2025; however, on our Calendar of Worship we call it the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. This is simply because the first Sunday of January in 2025 (and every other secular year) falls within the Liturgical Season of Christmas. Also, the second Sunday of the calendar year, almost always is observed as the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. This is the day which marks the close of the Season of Christmas and the opening of what is the longest season on our Calendar of Worship - Ordinary Time; the Lord's Baptism begins His public ministry and begins our new season.

If you find this all a bit perplexing or confusing, you are in good company. The Calendar of Worship centers on the most important day of the year, Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, which this year is celebrated on 20 April. Easter, however, is a movable rather than a fixed date on the Calendar of Worship, and this fact has been discussed and debated almost as long as there has been organized faith in Christ. The Council of Nicea which in 325 C.E., gave us the Creed which we still recite, also determined how we would put Easter on our calendar. The date is the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Vernal Equinox (i.e., the first day of spring). Once Easter is put on the calendar for a given year, the other dates, such as Ash Wednesday, the Sundays in Ordinary Time, etc., can be fixed. Next week, we will consider this question, ‘What is so ordinary about Ordinary Time?’

I would like to highlight another event which is scheduled early in both our calendar year and our year of worship; it is called the Week of Prayer for the Unity of Christians and runs 18 – 25 January. That idea of highlighting this week comes from the prayer of Jesus, “that they all may be one,” (John 17:21). We are encouraged during these days to learn about and pray for people whose religious traditions are different than our own.

Earlier this month I had an ecumenical experience which was completely unplanned, but all the more delightful. While being treated for an episode of Vertigo in the Emergency Department of our local hospital, I was prayed for and received the Sacrament of Anointing from our neighbor priest Father Michael Wimsatt, and the Chief Chaplain of the hospital, Reverend Jessica Jasper.

We are led in our Eucharistic Celebration this week and next by Father Michael Greenwell. Let us pray for the Nation as we observe this week, the Inauguration of our 47th President, Donald J. Trump.
