Micah 5:1-4; Psalms 80; Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1:38; Luke 1:39-45

### **MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN**

We have come to the final week of Advent, the final days of Mary's wondrous pregnancy. All four banners are in place; all four candles are lit. And this year, the final week is closer to a half-week. It begins at 4:00 pm on Saturday, 21 December and ends at 4:00 pm on Tuesday, 24 December. That is when the Season of Christmas actually begins. Let's review the Mass Schedule which was announced on the Second Sunday of Advent:

#### **Christmas Eve**

6:30 pm Saint Ambrose

9:30 pm Saint Ignatius

#### **Christmas Day**

8:00 am Saint. Ambrose

10:30 am Saint Clare

The Season of Christmas then, beginning with the Mass of the Vigil, will be highlighted by four more solemn days, stretching from the evening of 24 December through the evening of 11 January. As the four weeks of Advent represented four millennia before the Birth of Jesus, we can consider these two weeks as representative of the two millennia since His Birth. The mysteries to be highlighted include: The Nativity (25 December); the fact that He was born into a family (29 December); the wondrous role played out by His mother (1 January); and, the truth that His message is meant for all cultures (5 January). We will celebrate these solemnities as we have the weeks of Advent.

We have carefully noted the progressive weeks of the pregnancy of the Mother of Jesus, also our Blessed Mother of the Church. With all her faith and generosity of spirit, we can imagine how she might feel with this full final week: 'Oh Joseph, is this Baby ever going to come!' Her example has been for us an inspiration during Advent as we have examined our lives for evidence of the Birth of Jesus. Since the beginning of Advent, we have asked the questions: Can we find evidence that the Birth of Christ has made a difference in our lives? Is it Christmas? If we can answer 'Yes' to the first question, we can answer 'Yes' to the second question; and, we can celebrate. Merry Christmas, to all.
