MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

In last week's bulletin, I referred, if somewhat indirectly, to the on-going progression of life in our communities. I described physical improvement projects to our church buildings and grounds. However, I think of this dynamic in broader contexts as well. This week-end we turn the page on our seasonal calendar from the Summer to Autumn and next week-end, we complete the first quarter of the Fiscal Year 2025. In just over six weeks, we will have witnessed an historic Presidential Election, and we will have entered the final two months of the Calendar Year.

Of course, there are stationary highlights too, as we move through the rhythm of life, public dates like 4 July, 25 December, 1 January, and personal dates like birthdays and anniversaries. And our life of faith, which we as Catholics refer to as the Sacramental Life, is similar. We have four sacraments which usually happen only once such as Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination, and Marriage, and others which happen at regular intervals such as weekly (or daily) Communion, or quarterly (or more frequently) Anointing and Reconciliation. It is time in our Parishes and Oratory for these last two: Anointing is this week-end and Reconciliation is next week-end at the Parishes and on 6 October at the Oratory.

And, today at Saint Ambrose we celebrate the Baptism of HAZEL ANN BYRD, infant daughter of Brett Alan and Sarah Rae Byrd, nee, Killingbeck. Hazel is also sister to Will and Adeline Rae Byrd. We welcome baby Hazel and congratulate her family.


