MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

As with most weeks, I prepare to write these paragraphs by reviewing what was written for this Sunday in previous years. On more than one occasion I have noted a considerable amount of precipitation, which we might quickly note, is not all that uncommon in mid-late March in Kentucky. I have, however, made a personal notice of 15 March, a day on which I hung bed sheets to dry outside, and only a few hours later experienced the beginning of what would become a 4-inch rain accumulation in Hardin County. Now to our worship; we find on this third week-end of Lent, as we do each year, the theme of water. Exercising our option to study the readings from Year A, we have the stories of the water-from- the rock (Exodus 17:3-7) and the Woman-at-the well (John 4:5-42).

It is of course the saving water of Baptism, which begins our life in Christ, which is celebrated through the sacramental system of our faith. I have been happy in recent years to provide lessons for a dozen families whose 7 – 8-year-old children wish to prepare for First Holy Communion. When those children were baptized as Catholics, their parents were encouraged to be “the first and best teachers” of their children in the life of faith. I ask the parents (as well as godparents and grandparents), to study the material and teach the children. I tell them too, that at any point in the lesson they feel they need assistance, they can call on me, to meet with them at home or at church. Last week, I met with Lynn McDaniel, Director of Faith Formation for the Archdiocese, and received encouragement from her in this approach.

The sacramental system is the central element of our lives as Roman Catholics because it brings us into direct contact with Jesus Christ, the Central Person in our lives as Christians. Lent is a wonderful time to enrich our thinking about the sacraments. Two of them which we celebrate quarterly and will during this holy season, are what I refer to as Sacraments of Weakness. Here is our schedule:

Sacrament of Anointing

Sacrament of Reconciliation
