MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

This past Wednesday, we quietly celebrated the Feast Day of a saint, who made a major change in the lives of our ancestors here in Kentucky and really throughout the Catholic world. Saint Pius X, who served as Pope from 1903 until his death on 20 August of 1914, changed the age at which a person could receive Holy Communion for the first time. Prior to his guidance in 1910, Catholics did not receive Communion until their late teens, and then were encouraged to receive no more often than monthly. This Holy Father established age seven as the time for First Communion and encouraged daily reception and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Saint Pius X, who was born Giuseppe Sarto, has an interesting biography. His nick-name was Bepi, and he was one of eight children of a working-class family; the parents farmed and maintained jobs in the public sector. His life-story is a very interesting read in which we learn that he himself was beyond the age that we now consider normal for the First Reception of Holy Communion. We have this sweet and saintly man to thank for the change. Pope Saint Pius X, pray for us.

Continuing this same theme, let's look at some more recent history. It was during this week in 2021, that then Archbishop Joseph Kurtz announced his intention to re-instate the Catholic obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, an obligation which had been historically suspended since 16 March of 2020. As the restored obligation went into effect on the week-end of 4-5 September of 2021, the Archbishop reinforced the admonition that anyone who has a legitimate fear of endangering one's own health or the health of others is not obliged to attend. He continued to urge all who are eligible to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and its variants and obligated all who choose not to receive the inoculations, to wear face coverings in church.

I have frequently spoken of how edified I am by the desire of our membership to come to Mass and Holy Communion. You have wanted to attend even when you were not required. You strengthened my faith, and you inspire my increased love of the Blessed Sacrament.
