MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

The Gospel acclamation for today's Mass is a spontaneous expression which people voiced about Jesus after they had seen Him feed the multitudes. It is also an expression which people over the centuries might use about individuals who have been outstanding examples of holiness in our midst. Sometime the outcry is a special message such as we witnessed world-wide in the media when the late Pope John Paul II was being laid to rest. People cried out: *Santo Subito*, Italian for "canonize him, now." One of the news reporters who knew church history, commented that it was comparable to when crowds in the City of Milan cried out: "Ambrose, Bishop." Yes, that was our Ambrose, and he did become Bishop. We will write more about that in December, for his feast day on the 7th.

Next week in this column, we will write about Saint Clare of Assisi, whose feast day is observed on 11 August each year. This year, there will be a Mass celebrated by Archbishop Shelton Fabre, recognizing the 150th anniversary of the church building. Mark your calendars for the evening of 11 August (5:00 pm start); more information will be available next week.

Wednesday of this week, though, is the feast of Saint Ignatius Loyola. One year before Christopher Columbus "sailed the ocean blue," a man was born who would inspire many others to sail it too. This was Ignatius, a nobleman who was born in the Castle of Loyola in Spain. As a young soldier, he was wounded in a war between Spain under King Charles V, and France under King Francis I. During convalescence, he reflected on the Lives of the Saints and gave his life entirely over to spiritual growth. During this time, he also wrote The Spiritual Exercises, which remains today a classic of religious writing and a source of guidance to people the world over.

Eventually, he became a priest and successfully inspired other men (including Saint Francis Xavier) to form a band of missionaries called the Society of Jesus, aka, Jesuits. In their early decades, they spread Christianity to South America and Far East Asia, as well as throughout Europe. One of their number, an Englishman named John Carroll, became the first Bishop and Archbishop in America; he ordained Benedict Joseph Flaget, the first Bishop in Kentucky. Of many other famous members of the Society of Jesus today, the most prominent is our current Pope Francis I. While they retain their missionary zeal today, Jesuits are perhaps better known for their incredible array of High Schools, Colleges, and Universities throughout America and the World.

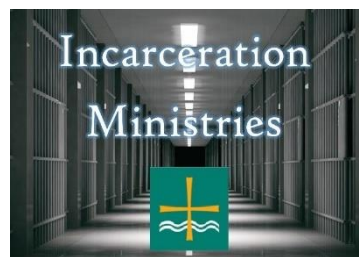
