## XXVIIth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B; 6 October, 2024

Genesis 2:18-24; Psalms 128; Hebrews 2:9-11; 1 John 4:12; Mark 10:2-16

**Prayer after Communion:** Grant us, almighty God, that we may be refreshed and nourished by the Sacrament which we have received, so as to be transformed into what we consume, through Christ our Lord.....



### MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

The Letter to the Hebrews provides us with the second reading for all of the Sundays of October and three of the four Sundays in November. Although it is called a Letter, it is written more in the style of an Essay: it is uncertain as to who the writer is. The theme of the essay is Jesus the perfect priest. He is called perfect not simply because of His divinity, but because He offers the perfect sacrifice, the sacrifice of Himself. The quotation captioned above is not from today's Mass but from the Mass of the XXIXth Sunday in Ordinary Time, (20 October). It serves as a key to the entire Essay, which is great reading for anyone wanting to develop a better personal relationship with Jesus.

I don't mind admitting that my personal familiarity with this section of the Christian Scriptures was by chance. In my first year of graduate school, one professor put the twenty-seven titles from the New Testament on strips of paper, as if in a horse-race-jackpot. Whichever title a student selected would be the topic for a research paper. I drew Hebrews. Over fifty years later, I still profess that no book of the Bible has had a greater impact on the path my life has taken. Asking if he has a favorite book of the Bible is a great way to start a conversation with Father Mike Greenwell, who is with us for the Sundays of October. Welcome Father Mike.
