## Second Sunday of Advent, Year C; 08 December, 2024

Baruch 5:1-9; Psalm 126; Philippians 1:4-11; Luke 3:4; Luke 3:1-6

*"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths."*

**Collect or Opening Prayer:** Almighty and merciful God, may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out in haste to meet Your Son, but may our learning of heavenly wisdom gain us admittance to His company, He lives and reigns forever and ever .....

**Prayer Over the Offerings:** Be pleased O Lord with our humble prayers and offerings and, since we have no merits to plead our cause, come we pray, to our rescue with the protection of Your mercy, through Christ our Lord.....

**Prayer after Communion:** Replenished by the food of spiritual nourishment we humbly beseech You O Lord, that through our partaking in this mystery, You may teach us to judge wisely the things of earth and hold firm to the things of heaven, through Christ our Lord.....



### MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

This holy season of Advent introduces us to a very important group of Biblical characters known as Prophets. We will hear from many including: Anna, Elizabeth, Samuel (son of Hannah), the great Isaiah, and most important of all, John the Baptist. Today we will focus on Baruch and John the Baptist in particular. Baruch, though obscure compared to others such as Daniel and Isaiah, nonetheless has some important teachings. In addition to this Second Sunday in Advent in Year C, we hear from Baruch at the Easter Vigil every year. As Baruch is obscure, John the Baptist is prominent..... and weird! He lives in the desert, eats off the land like a mountain man, wears bizarre clothing, and boldly confronts a King (Herod). Yet Jesus gives this John a compliment unlike any received by any other person in the New Testament. He has been compared in some ways to modern day prophets such as Mahatma Gandhi and Martin Luther King, Jr. John uses the power of words to change lives, to speak truth to power.

With her picture in a place of prominence in our sanctuaries, we are appropriately highlighting the Blessed Mother as the central figure in the Advent story. And, of the two major days dedicated to her December, today has special significance for us as American Catholics. Of all her titles, the Immaculate Conception is the one under which the United States is dedicated as a nation, with her Shrine in Washington, DC. This year, the holy day is celebrated on the 9th, and you will find the readings and prayers for Mass in the Missalette. However, the United Conference of Catholic Bishops has dispensed the obligation.

Of course, there are two other Holy days within the next four weeks. Here is the schedule for their Masses.
