MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

The much-anticipated (just because it is one of my personal favorites) Good Shepherd Sunday, is here. Of the several references in Scripture to Jesus as the Good Shepherd, one in the tenth chapter of Saint John's Gospel which we read today is quite emphatic; Jesus is really wanting to make this clear, especially to His opponents among the Pharisees. Their concept of God is rather far-removed from the idea of a caring personal protector.

We hear also from Saint Peter, who as the first pope, followed directly in the footsteps of Jesus as the Chief Shepherd of the flock, the church. While we often hear the words of Saint Peter from his writings (two letters in the New Testament), We hear today from his preaching. He does that quite a bit in the Acts of the Apostles, and he does so very boldly challenging the Jewish leadership over their not recognizing Jesus as the Messiah. Saint John's letter also, though it does not include the metaphor of the shepherd and the sheep, nonetheless describes our relationship to Christ as one characterized by real affection, truly divine love.

Chief Pastor or Shepherd is how several of the modern-day popes have thought of themselves, and taking their cue from Jesus and Saint Peter, have used the title as well as the approach. This seems to be especially true of Jorge Bergoglio, former Archbishop of Buenos Aires in Argentina, now in his twelfth-year reigning as Pope Francis I, the first Pope from the Americas. Of the several accounts of his life, the biography which I have read and recommend is by Austen Ivereigh entitled, The Great Reformer. I also highly recommend a movie, which though it has not been marketed in theaters, continues to be available through NETFLIX. It is called "The Two Popes," and received Oscar nomination for the actors who portrayed Popes Francis I and Benedict XVI. If you have NETFLIX and want me to watch it with you, I will bring the popcorn!
