Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11; Psalm 47; Ephesians 1:17-23; Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15-20

Collect or Opening Prayer: Gladden us with holy joys Almighty God and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving for the Ascension of Christ Your Son is our exaltation, and where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope, through Christ our Lord.....

Prayer Over the Offerings: We offer sacrifice now in supplication O Lord to honor the wondrous Ascension of Your Son; grant we pray that through this most holy exchange we too may rise up to the heavenly realms, through Christ our Lord.....

Prayer after Communion: Almighty and ever-living God, Who allow those on earth to celebrate divine mysteries, grant we pray that Christian hope may draw us onward to where our nature is united with You, through Christ our Lord.....



MESSAGE FROM FATHER BROWN

This bulletin, as with several throughout the year, contains more than one combination of readings and prayers. We have the information for today's Mass of the Sixth Sunday of Easter, but we also have the Mass for this coming Thursday, the fortieth day since Easter, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The story of Jesus' earthly farewell is told by Matthew and Mark, each in the closing lines of his gospel account (Matthew 28:16-20 and Mark 16:14-20). Luke also closes his gospel with a brief description (Luke 24:50-53). However, his more complete narrative is found in his second book and forms the first reading for the Mass of Ascension Thursday (Acts of the Apostles 1:6-11). It is truly a wondrous moment in the life not only of our Savior, but in the life of the infant church of His followers. We celebrate Ascension Thursday as a holy day, but as has been the case for about four years now, there is no obligation to attend Mass.

Even more important than Jesus' farewell with all its emotional drama and power, is His commission to spread the word and His promise to send His Holy Spirit to aid His people in carrying out that commission. The fulfillment of that promise is celebrated ten days after the Ascension on the great Feast of Pentecost (19 May). In anticipation of that, we receive instruction about the importance of Pneumatology (the study of the Spirit) in today's first reading and the third (gospel) reading for Thursday's Mass. It is the coming of the Holy Spirit which gives the Apostles the courage to follow the commission of Jesus to preach His message and to baptize those who receive it. Cornelius, the man who asks for baptism in today's first reading, represents us, since he is one of the first of the Gentiles to follow Jesus. We will hear the dramatic story of the coming of the Spirit, the birthday of the Church, just two weeks from now.
